During our fiscal year which ended in June 2022, our volunteers worked 9,778 hours, which is an economic impact of \$292,851, based on guidelines set forth by the Independent Sector. We are still on cloud 9 following our Uniting for Change Luncheon on April 12! The Greenville community showed up with enthusiasm to hear bestselling author Stephanie Land's inspiring personal story of living through homelessness and poverty as a single working mother. We also heard from United Ministries' participant, Amber, who moved us with her story of courage and determination to make a better life for her children.

We are so grateful to all who have supported our Uniting for Change campaign, and invite you to help us meet our \$500,000 goal!

The primary goal of this campaign is to double the capacity of our Emergency Shelter program by offering 10 additional apartments for families in need. These funds will <u>also</u> sustain our mission of supportive services including emergency assistance, mental health counseling, economic mobility coaching, and GED tutoring.

Right now, we have over 150 homeless families with children on our waiting list for emergency shelter.

This list is made up of single moms and dads, grandparents raising grandchildren, couples desperately trying to keep their families together. For so many of them, Land's words ring true, "It isn't the ability to make good choices, it's having good choices in the first place."


