
United Ministries is a direct service organization that serves individuals and families experiencing scarcity by providing basic needs for stability and support services to achieve self-sufficiency.

PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT

Housing Expansion

With the skyrocketing cost of rent and home prices, demand for United Ministries' housing programs continues to exceeded our capacity. Thanks to the generosity of donors who gave through our 2023 Uniting for Change Luncheon and others who donated directly to our Housing program, we are adding 12 new units to our Housing program – taking us to 36 housing units!

Mental Health Counseling

For the last 54 years, United Ministries has been serving the Greenville community. During this time, we have learned that financial self-sufficiency cannot be obtained and maintained without psychological self-sufficiency, they are inextricably tied. After efforts to refer participants to outside therapists were unsuccessful, we realized that United Ministries needed to offer mental health counseling alongside our traditional programming. We are pleased to have a licensed mental health therapist, Joel Koontz, on-site at United Ministries, offering counseling, free of charge, to all of our participants.

Joel believes "the process of change, any type, must include radical and reliable self-compassion and curiosity. We don't learn this without first experiencing it. That's what UM offers its participants across all programs and what my position is most explicitly privileged to integrate. It is from this place that people can find resiliency. From making meaning of what hardship they have and are experiencing, to newly and more adaptively relating to themselves, others, and their purpose in the world."

At United Ministries we have created a warm, welcoming space where our participants feel accepted and valued. Our staff purposefully cultivates an environment of belonging for all who come to us, and it is our privilege to walk alongside them on their journey to financial and psychological self-sufficiency.




