What a year 2024 was! I'm especially reminded of the host of community members who have surrounded our mission in the aftermath of Hurricane Helene. You stepped up to provide yourselves and your financial support to help those in need, and you did it quickly, with great care, and with huge hearts of kindness!

As we live into the new year, United Ministries is being called upon to respond to the growing number of chronically homeless adults who regularly visit our Place of Hope day shelter. We serve over 1,000 unique individuals a year and provide showers, laundry services, and case management to them. However, it's become almost impossible to locate housing for these participants who are often at the lowest income levels. In 2025, we will work with our Board of Directors, staff, and key funders to determine how United Ministries can best serve chronically homeless adults who need our help to find stable, affordable housing.

This report to our community highlights the incredible work we've been able to do over the last year, hand in hand with your support! We're excited for you to see a few highlights of the ways that together, we've been able to impact our participants' lives in truly meaningful, long-lasting ways.

I hope you'll make plans to join us on Wednesday, April 2nd for our annual Uniting for Change luncheon. This year's program will feature Dr. Jim O'Connell, a trailblazer in medicine who has spent over 40 years caring for Boston's most vulnerable "rough sleepers"—a term he uses for those who are living unsheltered. His inspirational message will focus on how we can continue to work together to build a community of care and compassion in Greenville County.

I want you to know that I am so deeply grateful for your generous support of our mission. Because of your support, we have been able to come alongside thousands of individuals and families in our community at critical times of need. We both celebrate what we've been able to do and remain committed to continuing this work ahead with determination and conviction.







THANK YOU VOLUNTEERS



Over the last several years, we have expanded our partnership with the non-profit Economic Mobility Pathways (EMPath), who provides trainings and education in Mobility Mentoring [®]—an evidence-based approach to economic mobility coaching, focused on mitigating the traumatic effects of scarcity on cognitive functioning and bandwidth, and bolstering executive functioning skills. United Ministries participants have seen such great success with these tools that our organization is in the process of expanding Mobility Mentoring [®] into all of our programs!

Place of Hope Day Shelter

For 54 years, United Ministries has purposefully cultivated a welcoming space founded on care, compassion, and continuous improvement, responding with supportive services to address the most pressing needs of the Greenville community. As the homeless population of Greenville continues to grow, one program in particular highlights the importance of intentional spaces of belonging: the Place of Hope Day Shelter. Committed to serving adults experiencing homelessness, Nick Bush, Associate Director of Place of Hope, and Christy Coffee, Program Associate, work alongside volunteers to provide hygiene services, case management, and supportive services for self-sufficiency.

On the importance of community, Nick explained "At Place of Hope our folks may

be in their addiction, they may be intoxicated, they may be in their mental health crisis, so what we create there is a community where a person is comfortable and we try to help them as much as we can. The average is probably about 55 people a day, we do anywhere from 20 to 30 showers a day. There really is nowhere else in town where a person can come and do their laundry and shower, and even get their mailing. It really is an essential service."

At United Ministries, we prioritize the needs of our participants, ensuring all feel accepted and valued. With the support of our staff, volunteers, Board of Directors, and supportive community, we are working together to ensure everyone has access to the opportunities and resources to thrive.









FISCAL YEAR BY THE NUMBERS
